Ringers will be contracted to replace with a native variety in a better location. The Roads crew will also be giving the large Oak a heavy prune in November in order to preserve it as long as possible. Knapik also reported that Levy season is fast approaching and encouraged the Board to begin looking at the Townships financial status in order to determine funding needs.

C. Highway Commissioner's report

Podgorski reported on the ongoing paving and drainage projects throughout the Township. Podgorski also reported that the mulching machine is again operational.

D. Supervisor's / BACOG report

Kainz reported that the concrete walkway in front if the building should be replaced in the next few weeks. The current walkway is deteriorating. Kainz also reported that he will be applying for the Community Development Grant in order to create accessibility to the Food Pantry by installing an elevator.
